- One Book,
- One Message

"The Masoretic tradition regarded the books of Ezra and Nehemiah as one book and referred to it as the Book of Ezra. This was also the Greek tradition, and the same Greek name, Esdras, was given to both books. The division into separate books does not occur until the time of Origen (fourth century C.E.) and this division was transferred into the Vulgate ... It was not until the 15th century that Hebrew manuscripts, and subsequently all modern printed Hebrew editions, followed this practice of dividing the books ..."

Ezra-Nehemiah

- three returns to Jerusalem in fulfilment of Jeremiah's prophecy of the end of the 70 years captivity (Jer 29:10), and Daniel's prophecy of the walls of Jerusalem being rebuilt over a troubled 49 year period (Dan 9:25).
- The first return under Zerubbabel led to the building of the second temple.
- the return of Ezra the priest and scribe.
- The third return of Nehemiah and his small group led to the building of the wall, and completes the process of restoration.

 - Altar built, temple foundation laid, 537 BCE
- Cambyses 530-522 BCE.
- Darius | 522-486 BCE.
 - Temple finished, 516 BCE.

 - Esther 479 BCE
- Artaxerxes | 465-424 BCE.
 - Temporarily halts rebuilding of Jerusalem, ca. 464-458 BCE,
 - Ezra goes to Jerusalem 458 BCE.

Ezra 4-6 - Explaining the reverse chronology
Official **archival searches** are referred to in each of the four letters: Ezra 4:15, 4:19, 5:17, and 6:1.

"The officials named in 4:7 were apparently the keepers of a major **archive** ... They had been asked by Artaxerxes to search their archive for records relating to the rebuilding of Jerusalem ... around the time when Nehemiah reopened the question of Jerusalem's wall. The issue had been left hanging by Artaxerxes' decree that the work on the wall be stopped, that is, suspended "until I give the order." Before issuing that decree, Artaxerxes had ordered a search of the archives (Ezra 4:19), and it seems reasonable to assume that a new search would be necessary before a new decree could be issued allowing the work to resume. In the course of their search, Bishlam and his colleagues found four relevant letters. They copied them onto a new roll, which they sent to the king".

Ezra 4:6. And in the reign of Ahasuerus, in the beginning of his reign, wrote they unto him an accusation against the inhabitants of Judah and Jerusalem.

23 Now when the copy of king Artaxerxes' letter was read before Rehum, and Shimshai the scribe, and their companions, they went up in haste to Jerusalem unto the Jews, and made them to cease by force and power.

 Flash forward ends and chronology resumes at the time of Darius - v 24 possibly an archive note/memorandum

24 Then ceased the work of the house of God which is at Jerusalem. So it ceased unto the second year of the reign of Darius king of Persia ...

Ezra-Nehemiah's mode of presentation places documents, and climactically the written Torah, as the decisive impetus for the events that transpire. Ultimately, the Torah, rather than priests or kings or prophets, becomes the authoritative source for communal life".

Import of lists and documents

- The names of individuals are known to the God of heaven and can be recorded in the Book of Life
- The documents give evidence of official sanction for the work
- Provide evidence of the continuity of possession of Jerusalem by the Jews
- Indicate the ways of providence at work in a non-miraculous age
- Emphasise the power of the written word to influence events and people

The symmetrical structure of Ezra-Nehemiah

- A. the return under Zerubbabel and list of returnees (Ezra 1-2) and celebration and keeping of the commandments of the Torah (3:1-6)
 - B. building the Temple and opposition (Ezra 3:7-6:22)
 - C. Ezra's return (Ezra 7-8)
 - D. Purification of the community (Ezra 9-10)
 - C'. Nehemiah's return (Neh 1-2)
 - B'. Building the Walls and opposition (Neh 3-7:3)
- A'. the return under Zerubbabel and list of returnees (Neh 7:4-72) and celebration and implementation of the commandments of the Torah (Neh 8-13)

Import of structural parallels

- The symmetry created by repetitions emphasise the unity of the book
- Ezra 4 gives a "flash forward" to the times of Nehemiah, so binding the two records together
- this is reinforced by the shared events and descriptions
- work begun by Zerubbabel completed by Nehemiah when Jerusalem becomes the "holy City" (Neh 11:1)
- the central focus of the scroll is restoring separation from the world



- There is, of course, a need for ascertaining whether an applicant for immersion understands and believes the truth. The validity of immersion depends upon believing the truth. In apostolic times, this belief was evidenced by the simple admission that Jesus was the Christ.
- The case stands differently now when nominal believers in Christ associate with their historical belief, doctrines subversive of the scheme of truth which centres in his name. It is no longer sufficient for a man to say he believes in Christ, unless the statement mean that he believes the truth concerning Christ. The simple confession of belief in Christ does not bring with it the guarantee it did in apostolic times, that the doctrines embodied in Christ are received. The apostacy has held sway for centuries, and still reigns with undiminished power; and through its influence, there exists around us a state of things in which, while, so far as words go, there is universal profession of belief in Christ, there is an absolute and virulent rejection of the truth of which Christ is the embodiment ...

- "33. -- Examination of Applicants for Immersion.
- At the same time, we must beware of an attitude savouring of priestly arrogance. We must distinctly recognise that the efficacy of the candidate's immersion in no way depends on the administration or sanction of those who may examine him. We cannot impart validity to immersion by compliance, nor can we vitiate it by withholding countenance, but, as a matter of order and self-protection, we are bound to ascertain (and in these days to apply the test rigidly) whether a man applying for immersion believes the truth of the gospel or not.



Broken walls? - Loss of ecclesial integrity leaving the flock vulnerable - lost sheep, wolves ...

Gates burned? - no control over fellowship or influences How?

- Doctrinal errors
- Adoption of spirit of the age (humanism, relativism) social works/community church, alternative lifestyles (social media)
- Moral issues
- Materialism and Sloth indifference to error, taking the easy route, stopping preaching and youth activities, shortcuts to Bible study and poor exposition.







- A. Neh 13:15 In those days saw I in **Judah** some treading wine presses **on the sabbath**, and bringing in sheaves, and lading asses; as also wine, grapes, and figs, and all manner of burdens, which they brought into Jerusalem **on the sabbath day**:
- B. and I testified against them in the day wherein they sold victuals.
- A'. 16 There dwelt men of **Tyre** also therein, which brought fish, and all manner of ware, and sold **on the sabbath** unto the children of Judah, and in Jerusalem.
- B'. 17 Then I contended with the nobles of Judah, and said unto them, What evil thing is this that ye do, and profane the sabbath day? 18 Did not your fathers thus, and did not our God bring all this evil upon us, and upon this city? yet ye bring more wrath upon Israel by profaning the sabbath.

- A. Neh 13:19 And it came to pass, that when **the gates** of Jerusalem began to be dark before the sabbath, I commanded that **the gates** should be shut, and charged that they should not be opened till after the sabbath: and some of my servants set I at **the gates**, that there should no burden be brought in on the sabbath day.
- B. 20 So the merchants and sellers of all kind of ware **lodged** without Jerusalem once or twice.
- C. 21 Then I testified against them, and said unto them, Why lodge ye about the wall? if ye do so again, I will lay hands on you.
 - B'. From that time forth **came they no more** on the sabbath.
- A'. 22 And I commanded the Levites that they should cleanse themselves, and that they should come and keep **the gates**, to sanctify the sabbath day.
