"To turn, return."

TWOT

"The Bible is rich in idioms describing man's responsibility in the process of repentance... All these expressions of man's penitential activity, however, are subsumed and summarised by this one verb shub. For better than any other verb it combines in itself the two requisites of repentance: to turn from evil and to turn to the good..."
