



#3404 • *miseo* • verb • to hate, pursue with hatred, detest, idiomatic phrase: 'to kill in the heart' or 'to spit at someone in the heart,' to hold a grudge against, have malicious unjustifiable feelings against; also to slight, to show disregard or indifference,

Vines: the sin lies in the inward disposition (attitude), of which the act is only the outward expression.

"[the] darkness"

#4653 · skotia · noun · darkness due to lack of light · ignorance of divine things (darkness is the absence of light)

1 JOHN 2

10 He that loveth his brother abideth in the light, and there is none occasion of stumbling in him.

Abideth #3306 • meno • verb • to remain, sojourn, to "remain in the house", to wait for one.

Occasion of Stumbling #4625 • skandalon • noun • the trigger or trap, the snare one is drawn into (the stick that is moved and springs the trap), any impediment placed in the way that causes one to stumble or fall.







hate #3404 · miseo · verb · pursue with hatred, detest

despise #2706 • *kataphroneo* • **verb** • from 2596 • *kata* • participle – against down from, + 5426 • *phroneo* • **verb** • to feel to think, have an opinion, be of the same mind ... therefore to distain, think little or nothing of



Lust of the Flesh

Lust #1939 • *epithumia* • noun • the desire, craving, **desire** for what is forbidden.

TDNT: Sin that dwells within a man and which controls him. The desire as impulse, as a motion of the will - the thought of satisfaction gives pleasure. It is anxious self-seeking. It bursts upon him with the force of immediacy.

Flesh #4561 · sarx · noun · the body of a man, the sensuous nature of man, the animal nature with cravings which incite sin, the physical nature subject to suffering, the earthly nature of man apart from divine influence and therefore prone to sin and opposed to God.

"the Lust of the Flesh"

Mark 14:38

Watch ye and pray, lest ye enter into temptation. The spirit truly is ready, but the flesh is weak.

John 6:63

It is the spirit that quickeneth; the flesh profiteth nothing: the words that I speak unto you, they are spirit, and they are life

Romans 7:5

For when we were in the flesh, the motions of sins, which were by the law, did work in our members to bring forth fruit unto death.

Lust of the Eyes

Lust #1939 • *epithumia* • verb • the desire, craving, **desire** for what is forbidden.

TDNT: Sin that dwells within a man and which controls him. The desire as impulse, as a motion of the will - the thought of satisfaction gives pleasure. It is anxious self-seeking. It bursts upon him with the force of immediacy.

Eyes #3788 · opthalmos · noun · the eyes of the mind, faculty of knowing, to look at, behold

"the Lust of the Eyes"

Matt 6:22-23

The light of the body is the eye: if therefore thine eye be single (healthy), thy whole body shall be full of light. But if thine eye be evil, thy whole body shall be full of darkness. If therefore the light that is in thee be darkness, how great is that darkness!

Matt 5:27-29

That whosoever looketh on a woman to lust after her hath committed adultery with her already in his heart. And if thy right eye offend thee, pluck it out, and cast it from thee: for it is profitable for thee that one of thy members should perish, and not that thy whole body should be cast into hell.



keep #8104 • *shamar* • verb • to keep, have guard of, observe, give heed, be a watchman, to retain, to treasure up in memory, keep within bounds, preserve, protect

keep #5341 • *natsar* • verb • to guard, watch over, preserve from dangers, guard with fidelity, to keep close, blockade



Pride of Life

Pride • 212 • alazoneia • noun • empty braggart talk, insolent and empty assurance, which trusts in its own power and resources and shamefully despises and violates diving law, impious and empty presumption which trusts in the stability of earthly things.

Thayer's: empty braggard talk, sometimes also empty display in act, swagger. An insolent and empty assurance, which trusts in its own power and resources and shamefully despises and violates divine laws and human rights. An impious and empty presumption which trust in the stability of earthly things (RV vaunting).

Life #979 · bios · noun · period or course of life; that by which life is sustained, resources, wealth, goods (ie. biosphere)

the ostentation of the life

Amplified

the lust of the flesh [the craving for sensual gratification], the lust of the eyes [greedy longings of the mind] an the pride of life [assurance in one's own resources or in the stability of earthly things]

the arrogance produced by material possessions

Pride of Life

Psalm 49:6–9

They that trust in their wealth, and boast themselves in the multitude of their riches; None of them can by any means redeem his brother, nor give to God a ransom for him: (For the redemption of their soul is precious, and it ceaseth for ever.) That he should still live for ever, and not see corruption.

∴ to have a mind that is exalted or lifted up

Trust #1679 • *elpizo* • verb form of ELPIS • hope... put their hope in



1 John 2

Anti-Christ • #500 • antichristos • noun • from #473 • Anti • verb (primary participle) • opposed to, opposite to, instead of or in place of + #5547 Christos • adjective • messiah, the anointed

Prating #5396 • *phluareo* • **verb** • to utter nonsense, talk idly, prate, bring forward empty charges or accusations

Cast out #1544 · Ekballo · verb · to cast out, drive out, send out, with notion of violence, to expel a person from society, banish, compel one to depart,

²⁰ But ye have an unction from the Holy One, and ye know all things.

Unction • #5545 • *chrisma* • noun • anything smeared on, an ointment, **an anointing oil** prepared from oil and aromatic herbs, used in ceremony of high priest





Liar #5583 • pseustes • noun • one who lies or breaks faith, a false man • from 5574 psuedomai • to speak deliberate falsehoods • to deceive by lying

Denieth #720 *arnomai* · verb · to deny, disregard, prove false to himself, abnegate, abjure, not to accept, reject, refuse something offered.

Christ #5547 Christos · adjective · messiah, the anointed · consecrated to the messianic office.

¹Beloved, believe not every spirit, but try the spirits whether they are of God: because many false prophets are gone out into the world.

Try #51381 · dokimazo · verb · to test, examine, prove, scrutinize, to see whether a thing is genuine or not, like metal checking for real counterfeited coins

False Prophets #5578 • *pseudoprophetes* • **noun** • from #5571 • *pseudes* • **adjective** • lying, **deceitful**, false • to deceive one by a lie + #4396 • *prophets* • **noun** • one who is moved by the Spirit of God, a **spokesman who solemnly declares to men what he has received by inspiration.**



Confesseth

Confesseth #3670 · homologeo · verb · to say the same thing as another, to agree with, ascent to, declares, admits

Flesh

Flesh #4561 • sarx • noun • flesh – the soft living substance of the living body which covers the bones • the body of a man • animal nature • human nature prone to sin and opposed to God



Wherefore, as by one man sin entered into the world, and death by sin; and so death passed upon all men, for that all have sinned:

Sin-prone nature was inherited from Adam

Romans 5

¹⁸Therefore as by the offence of one judgment came upon all men to condemnation...

¹⁹For as by one man's disobedience many were made sinners...

Offence #3900 *paraptoma* • noun • to fall beside or near something (miss the mark), a lapse or deviation from truth

Condemnation $#2631 \cdot katakrima \cdot noun \cdot sentence \cdot$ in divine use the sentence = the execution of sentence)

Disobedience #3876 *parakoe* • noun • hearing amiss or incorrectly, or to not be willing to hear and therefore disobedient

Made #2525 *kathistemi* · verb · to set, place, put, appoint, constituted, rendered, conduct or bring to a certain place





Righteousness • 1345 *dikaioma* • noun • that which has been deemed right so as to have force of law, that which has been established and ordained by law, judicial decision

Obedience #5218 *hupakoe* • noun • compliance, submission, obedience rendered to anyone's counsel, obedience in observing the requirements

Righteous #1342 *dikaos* • adjective • observing laws, upright, virtuous, Keeping God's commands, approved or acceptable to God, their way of thinking, feeling and acting is wholly conformed to the will of God








²Hence the married woman is bound by Law to the living husband; but if the husband die, she is released from the law of the husband...

⁴Therefore, my Brethren, you were put to death by the Law, through the body of the Anointed one, in order that you may belong to another,—to him that was raised from the Dead, that we should bring forth fruit to God.

The Messiah put "the body of sin" to death and thereby released us from the law of sin and death














¹⁶For verily he took not on him the nature of angels; but he took on him the seed of Abraham.
